

Online Learning Teacher Expectations and Guidelines

Day to Day

Task Setting

Specialist tasks/projects/work sent to relevant HOY bypm the previous day Daily video message to be sent 1st thing in the morning. Expectation of timing for morning and afternoon activities.

Register

Time to open and close the register.

Middle of the Day

Be available from ...am-...pm on Seesaw/relevant platform, emails and so on. Answer questions and queries on all platforms.

Marking and Feedback

Children will receive detailed feedback at two subjects and just a 'like' all other subjects. TA should be given a subject to comment on with bank of comments given to them as support. Subjects for marking will be decided as a team for consistency across the year group.

Live Learning

All Zoom meetings should be password protected.

Sessions should last approximately 10-15 mins for FS and KS1 and 15-20 mins for KS2 Teachers must be dressed in formal school attire.


General

All HOY should become a co-teacher on Seesaw for all classes in their year group



Online Learning Seesaw Class Teachers Guidelines Feedback All in depth feedback must include a pink and green as if it were in the children's schoolbooks on the subject that you are giving in-depth feedback. "Well done" and "Great" don't count as in-depth feedback which will support the children's progress in lessons. Student/teacher dialogue should be evident on Seesaw/relevant platform. Use a mixture of voice notes and written feedback. Most likely the children will respond more to voice notes as they miss you as teachers. Approving posts Class teachers should please "like" all specialist post before approval so the children know they have been seen on the day of submission. Specialist staff will then provide them with feedback. Know the Rules Children should not be able to comment on one another's work. Expectation of Children Positive Praise- dojo points, online reward charts School Star Assembly - Principal and Vice-principal to share Encourage participation on activities. Share expectations during your morning videos (work you are impressed by etc.)





Parents Expectations and Guidelines

Please support your child in meeting their online learning expectations through:

- Ensuring they have access to a device where they can login to Seesaw or relevant platforms used by the school.
- Supporting them in registering each morning and afternoon until they are confident in doing so alone.
- Encourage them to send messages to their teacher if they have any questions this should be done by the children where possible
- Encourage them to take their online learning seriously and check that it has been completed each day
- Message the teacher with any questions or queries you have as a parent.
- Set them small, achievable targets that will keep them motivated E.g. Let's try and do the maths activity before 10am then we can have a break and relax.
- Whilst teacher working hours are 7am-3pm, work can be completed after this if it is more convenient, as long as children register between ...am-....30am (Mon-Fri).
- Use other online learning tools to support learning E.g. 9ijakids, TTRS, EPIC.
- Please note that class teachers should only be contacted with questions regarding your child's class work. Any general queries about the closure, online learning process or other matters should be sent to reception@nameofschool.com

Student Expectations and Guidelines

Task Setting

All your work will be uploaded to Seesaw/relevant platform by class your teacher at 8.30am each day.

They will give you all the resources, instructions and information you need .

Registration

At 9am, your teacher will post: 'Good Morning (class name), this is your morning register.' You will reply: 'Good Morning, (teacher's name).

Middle of the Day

Your teachers will be available from 9am-2pm on Seesaw

Use Seesaw/relevant platform to ask your teacher any questions that you have about the work that has been set .

Marking and Feedback

Your teachers will send you feedback in lots of different ways, but usually voice recordings and comments .

Information Sharing

Any video, resources or information that your teacher sends as part of your online learning should not be shared on any other platform, including social media.

<u>General</u>

Take responsibility for your own learning as much as you can.
